#### Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport (PHF)

Distance to Williamsburg: Approximately 20 miles (about a 30-minute drive).

#### Richmond International Airport (RIC)

#### Norfolk International Airport (ORF)

Distance to Williamsburg: Approximately 60 miles (about a one hour drive).
